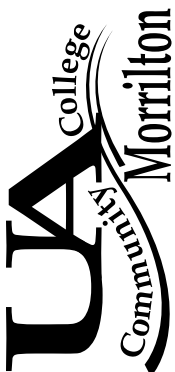

FAYETTEVILLE SHALE SCHOLARSHIP FUND, INC. CONTINUED

Established in 2006, the Fayetteville Shale Scholarship Fund is a 501(c) 3 organization with members representing companies working in the Fayetteville Shale. The organization's primary focus is fund-raising activities that will allow scholarship support to assist Arkansas residents enrolled in the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton Petroleum Technology program. Funds raised are donated to the UACCM Scholarship Committee, which awards scholarships based on financial need. Two types of scholarships are awarded: Regular scholarships, which are \$500 per semester; and Merit-Based for academic excellence, which are \$750 per semester.

At the end of each semester, the top performing student(s) who have earned 30 hours toward their technical certificate or associate degree will receive an additional \$1000 award for the following semester. Student(s) who achieve a 4.00 semester grade point average will qualify for this award.

Scholarship criteria is as follows:

1. All recipients must be a Petroleum Technology Major.
2. All recipient must have financial need based on *"*Cost-of-Attendance"* budget.
3. All students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 hours with at least six hours of courses that count towards the Petroleum Technology plan of study.
4. Scholarship is open to students who live in all the counties UACCM serves.
5. Scholarships awarded to first-semester students will be awarded based on high school grade point average of 2.75 or higher; or ACT scores of 17 on math, 19 on reading, and 19 on English; or COMPASS scores of 26 on algebra or 49 on pre-algebra, 83 on reading, and 77 on writing. Students who have completed 12 or more hours (including developmental) at another college or university must have a 2.75 or higher transfer grade point average.
6. Merit-based scholarships are based on a minimum 3.25 semester grade point average and endorsement from a Petroleum Technology instructor.
7. There is a possibility of scholarship renewal throughout the recipient's completion of the Petroleum Technology plan of study. Renewal requires a minimum 2.75 semester grade point average for regular scholarships or 3.25 semester grade point average for merit-based scholarships. Previous scholarship recipients must be selected by the scholarship committee each semester. There is no guarantee of renewal. Student must complete a new Scholarship Application each academic year (August-May).
 - a. Students may be considered for regular scholarship renewal for the subsequent semester, provided a 2.75 semester grade point average is maintained and student continues to demonstrate financial need.
 - b. Students may be considered for merit-based scholarship renewal for the subsequent semester, provided a minimum 3.25 semester grade point average is maintained and student continues to demonstrate financial need.
